

## Steering Committee 2020 John Wesley Long, Chairman

Since our last Annual Fall Meeting, the Steering Committee has met four times as scheduled. The first two meetings were held in person and the other two were held virtually. We plan to meet virtually for future meetings, as well. Each time we received financial reports and a report from Steve Laughman, the Associational Mission Strategist, regarding the work of the association. Here are the major items of business for the year:

- Officers for the year are John Wesley Long, Chairman, and Travis Graham, Vice-Chairman.
- HVAC for office and parsonage. Both units (one for the house and one for the office) were replaced including duct work under the house. Central Georgia Heating and Cooling did an excellent job and will continue to serve in a maintenance capacity.
- Tree Removal. At the request of our insurance company, we have received bids to remove some trees from the property and to trim back others. Final decisions on this work will be handled at the November meeting.
- Cliburn Scholarship. Rebecca Milby, a member of Meansville Baptist Church and a student at Southern Baptist Seminary, was awarded the Cliburn Scholarship. Rebecca is working toward a Master's degree in Biblical Counseling. She currently holds a degree in Art Therapy which she uses in her work at the Georgia Baptist Children's Home. We are thankful for the calling God has on Rebecca's life.

At the North American Mission Board (NAMB), it's all about the Gospel. Everything we do is to help churches and believers share Christ in their communities, North America and around the world. There were many highlights in 2019 as we served Southern Baptist pastors, churches and associations, but we want to start by thanking all those who gave so generously to the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering®. Southern Baptists gave a record \$61.6million to the offering, an all-time high. Pastors are NAMB's number one customer. We are here to serve them and help them succeed as they minister on the front lines. We serve pastors and churches in two primary ways: Send Relief, our compassion ministry arm, and Send Network, our church planting network. In addition to these two primary ministry areas, NAMB's Evangelism and Leadership Group, led by Johnny Hunt, exists to equip pastors and mobilize Southern Baptists for

evangelism. NAMB's Send Relief ministry is bringing help and hope to those most in need. Our Puerto Rico rebuild effort hosted hundreds of volunteers as residents continue to recover from Hurricane Maria, which struck in 2017. Send Relief is giving churches the opportunity to serve in areas such as poverty, refugees and internationals, adoption and foster care, human trafficking and crisis response. We now have seven Send Relief ministry centers (Appalachia, Atlanta, Las Vegas, New Orleans, New York, Pittsburgh and Puerto Rico) that are meeting needs in specific regions and giving Southern Baptists from all over North America opportunities to serve in long-or short-term settings. Here are a few highlights as we look back on the previous full year of ministry:

- Thanks to Southern Baptist giving, we are able to resource and support nearly 6,800 missionaries and chaplains. These men and women serve in difficult places and in challenging cultural contexts and many have left behind all that is familiar so they can tell people about Jesus.
- Southern Baptists added 908 new congregations in 2019, the most recent year for which data is available. This includes 552 new church starts, 59 new campuses and 297 new affiliations. We praise God for these new churches that are now part of the Southern Baptist family.
- Churches started since 2010 now account for 11% of all churches in the SBC and they report 18% of all SBC baptisms. Church plants are reaching people for Christ, and they are a positive force in our Southern Baptist family.
- Reversing the decline in baptisms won't be accomplished by a national entity, but we are making multiple evangelism resources available free to churches and emphasizing the annual SBC Baptism Sunday. We want to help Southern Baptists maintain evangelism and baptism as the top priority. We are grateful for the pastors and churches who are in the trenches of ministry. In the words of Jerry Garcia, "What a long, strange trip it's been." The past year has been one of the most difficult for churches in my lifetime. At our crowded meeting last fall, no one would have ever expected the changes that would take place in 2020. We have all faced these challenges the best we know how, and I am thankful for every pastor, leader, and church member who remained faithful to the task and persevered through it all. Our challenges are far from over. We do not know what the next year holds, but I am certain that God will once again remain faithful. We will move forward in hope.

Despite the struggles Centennial Baptist Association continues to thrive. Thank you to every church who faithfully supported the work of the association. I realize that many of our

churches have struggled financially, but God has met every need. At a time when it would be easy to focus on the state of your own church alone, you have worked with other churches to lift one another up. Many of us have lost people this year, and we have grieved together. We have renewed our focus on caring for one another, especially those who are most vulnerable among us. We have made sermons and Bible studies available online for those who cannot join us in person. We have been stretched and prodded to think of ministry outside the walls of the church, and we, the Church, have responded well.

The Centennial calendar was packed for 2020, but much of what we had planned was postponed or cancelled. Your church knows this reality all too well. However, we were able to continue with some of our vital ministries. The Dental Clinic was a success again this year. Pastor Roundtables continued both virtually and eventually in person. Ministers Connection was able to connect pastors to resources from our national and state entities. Baptist Collegiate Ministries at Gordon made necessary adjustments and took advantage of new opportunities. We are once again providing backpacks for children in South Georgia. And in a few weeks, students will gather for an abbreviated, outdoor EQUIP event. Centennial is moving forward with hope.

Replanting churches has been a necessary focus for the last couple of years. As we reported at the Annual Fall meeting last year, The Rock Church had just begun meeting again after months of preparation for a relaunch. Despite the challenges of COVID-19, I am pleased to report that The Rock Church is going strong. The average attendance is over 40 with multiple generations being represented. Small groups meet regularly in host homes. The outside elders continue to function in an advisory and accountability role. Additional renovations have been made, and the church hosted her first wedding since the restart when Pastor Wesley Lassiter and his bride, Lindsey, were married. I believe The Rock Church is the first of many churches that will go through a restart process. It will look differently for each church, but we will continue to seek the Lord as He builds His Church.

What will we experience in 2021? My hope is that you look forward to this next year in anticipation of what God will do through you and your church. Will we continue to face a health crisis? Probably. Will our country come together and address our problems? Possibly. Will the Church still have a mission to reach the lost around us? Absolutely. Will we meet this challenge with the passion and commitment deserving of the task? I sincerely expect so. I have hope that our churches will continue to meet needs, continue to preach the Gospel, and continue to lift up the name of Christ. We will look to Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, to guide us no matter what this next year holds.

When you look at the Centennial 2021 calendar, you will notice some tentative scheduling. Our practice will be to move forward cautiously, especially as it relates to large events.
