

STEERING COMMITTEE 2021

The Steering Committee has shifted all our meetings to a virtual format. Each time we received financial reports and a report from Steve Laughman, the Associational Mission Strategist, regarding the work of the association. Here are the major items of business for the year:

- Officers for the year are John Wesley Long, Chairman, and Travis Graham, Vice-Chairman.
- Tree Removal. At the request of our insurance company, we received bids to remove some trees from the property and to trim back others. This work was completed after our last fall meeting, but before the current budget year started in January.
- Cooperating Churches. It was determined after a review of our Constitution & By-laws that churches that disassociate from the SBC and/or the GBMB are still considered part of the Centennial Baptist Association as long as they remain Baptist, affirm the Baptist Faith & Message, and are mission-minded.
- Cliburn Scholarship. Unfortunately, there were no applicants for the Cliburn Scholarship this year, so we were
 unable to award anyone in 2021. We know that there are several people in our association who are pursuing a
 seminary degree at this time, so we would like to remind you to apply by April 1, 2022.
- Georgia Baptist Foundation. The Steering Committee voted to move up to \$48,000 from the general checking account to the Georgia Baptist Foundation account. Budget & Finance and the Treasurer were consulted to determine the exact amount.
- Restructuring. There has been some discussion about examining how our association is structured for ministry. We will be working with the AMS on this project throughout 2022.

Steering Committee lost two great men this year. Joe Andrews had served faithfully as a member of this committee and was a huge supporter of Centennial. Joe had participated in associational mission trips as well as helping with The Rock Church renovations. He was a mentor to many and an irreplaceable member of First Baptist Barnesville. Terry Threadgill served on the Steering Committee as well as other Centennial committees over the years. After retiring as Pastor of Yatesville, Terry provided pulpit supply at a number of our Centennial churches. He brought a calm, consistent voice of reason to each discussion which will be missed.

We are thankful for the churches who support Student Ministry in their own local context and in cooperation with area churches. This summer several Upson County joined together for a local missions effort called "UNITY in the Community." Because many of us were unable to plan mission trips, we focused our attention on what we could do locally. Students and leaders held block parties, brought food to first responders, moved furniture, and even cleaned gas station bathrooms. All of this was done with the intention of opening a door for the Gospel. Students met each evening for a time of worship and reporting on the day. We are already planning for UNITY again in 2022.

EQUIP Student Discipleship Weekend was held on Saturday, September 25 at Mount Olive Baptist Church. Our theme was EQUIP to STAND, focusing on Christian apologetics. Students heard two messages encouraging them to own and defend their faith. They also attended breakout sessions on topics relevant to the challenges they face. Some of the participating churches took the opportunity to provide host homes, additional Bible studies, and Sunday morning experiences that emphasized the theme. The new fall time for EQUIP seemed to work well, so we will be planning EQUIP 2022 for September next year.

Based on feedback from EQUIP we will be starting a Student Ministry Roundtable in November. Anyone who works with students is welcome to participate in the discussion. Topics will be based on the needs of the group. The first Roundtable will be held at The Pie in Thomaston on November 18 at 6:30 PM. At the North America Mission Board (NAMB), our main goal is to help pastors, churches and other Southern Baptist ministry partners more effectively engage the mission field in the United States, Canada and beyond.

Since 2011, an increasing number of churches and individuals have become more directly involved in church planting and other missions efforts through Send Network and Send Relief. These efforts revolve around the priority of planting new evangelistic churches—especially in the unreached and underserved areas such as large cities and regions outside the ministry.

In the last 100 years, Southern Baptists—and evangelicals in general—have lost significant ground in the church-to-population ratio. This is true especially in regions outside the southern United States and in the areas where more than 81 percent of the population lives—in and around large cities.

To help Southern Baptists close this gap, NAMB has identified more than 30 regional and strategic <u>Focus Areas</u> for church planting and compassion ministry. These areas have vast influence that, when reached, can become centers for gospel proclamation that make a global impact. In reaching these strategic focus areas, Southern Baptists can lead many to Christ in North America and around the world.

While NAMB focuses ministry in these areas, NAMB partners with Southern Baptists around North America to plant churches everywhere for everyone and serve communities across the continent by meeting needs and changing lives.

The Philadelphia Baptist Association was established in 1707 by five churches. They were committed to the principle that autonomous local churches should partner together for the cause of Christ. Out of those humble beginnings and following the pattern already set in England, other Baptist associations were formed throughout what would become the United States of America. In 1784 five churches in Georgia formed the first Baptist association in our state, appropriately naming it The Georgia Baptist Association. One hundred years later, ten churches from Flint River, Central, and Rehoboth Associations met in Barnesville to establish a new association with the blessings of their "mother"

associations. This new association was named Centennial Baptist Association in honor of centennial celebration of the Georgia Baptist Association. This annual fall meeting will be our 138th, and we are not slowing down any time soon.

At a time when the future of the world, including the state of historic Baptist institutions, seems uncertain I can boldly state that the Centennial Baptist Association is strong and moving forward. We still have much work to do, and we understand that we are more effective when we work together. The spirit of cooperation among our churches serves as an example of how God's Church impacts the lost world. We are making disciples together, and we intend to continue to do so until the Lord returns.

This year has not been without its challenges. One area of need that we recognize is that of Pastors and other ministry leaders to fill various ministry roles in our churches. For several years I have been talking with pastors about the need to raise up and equip called individuals from within our churches to serve. I see the fruit of that as God has called some from within our churches to serve in many leadership positions. We are blessed to have the Baptist Collegiate Ministries equipping students to serve and then encouraging them to serve the local church. The Preaching Teaching Lab provided tools this year for those wanting to become better proclaimers of God's Word. Early 2022 we plan to provide a workshop for anyone interested in leading worship in the local church. There are still churches in need of key leaders, so the work is far from finished. But I am hopeful that God is still calling, and we are being more intentional about equipping the called.

Missions is another area of need. We can celebrate the record giving to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering and the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. Every dollar of these offerings goes to the mission field. Your Cooperative Program dollars support ongoing work of the International Mission Board and the North American Mission Board, as well as our state entity, the Georgia Baptist Mission Board. You also support our six seminaries, making a sound, affordable theological education possible for those called to ministry and missions. But while all of this is worthwhile, I know many of you want a more hands-on missions experience. We pray that 2022 will be a time when restrictions are lessened, and we can get back to going on mission. In the meantime, some of you have been very creative in your mission endeavors. The team of youth leaders who organized UNITY in the Community this summer thought outside the box to provide students with local mission projects. Several of our churches have provided countless meals and other resources to those in need locally. As we move forward, we will once again begin organizing an association-wide missions event. We are now calling it REFOCUS, and you will hear more in the coming months.

I know that you will agree with me that we are called to do the best with what resources we have. This year you have once again demonstrated through your faithful giving to Centennial that you believe in the work we do. In an effort to be a good steward of your resources, I have been examining how we are organized as an association, specifically how our ministries function. Our job is not to replace the church but to encourage local churches to work together when it is advantageous to do so. My hope over the next several months is to collaborate with our Steering Committee to restructure how we do ministry. Our core purpose of "networking churches to make disciples" will not change. But the way we make decisions, how we operate, and the approach we take toward reaching our goals may change to serve the churches more effectively. Pray with me as we seek to become more effective for the Gospel. If you have input or would like to be involved in this restructuring process, please let me know.

In December I will begin my tenth year as your associational leader. Marni and I are grateful for each of you. The very word "association" means we work together, we are in relationship with one another, and we share things in common. What a privilege it is to serve the churches of Centennial Baptist Association at this time in our history! Even after 137 years of ministry our best years are still ahead of us.
