A Word from Your Mission Strategist, Steve Laughman





Our trip to Israel was life changing, shocking, and heartbreaking. My prayer for God's chosen people has forever changed. I wept when I heard the Muslim call to prayer. I giggled when a Jewish boy was chasing his father and yelled "Abba, Abba...". I felt the urgency of a Holocaust survivor pleading with me in German to never forget. I was torn by the many souvenir shops erected at holy sites. I was humbled by the majority of Israelis reverence to religion. I saw evidences of prophecy being fulfilled and I prayed with and for believers who live and work in the Holy Land. May God raise up a believing remnant of His chosen this side of His coming. May they understand Yeshua is the Messiah they yearn for yet adamantly deny. May the lovers of the Torah have an insatiable appetite for answers to

questions they can not articulate. May they discern corrupt teachings and be calloused to false doctrines. I pray for the generations of the veiled that Elohim may place within their hearts a burning desire to pursue truth about Christ. May they enter into redemption through a "new and living way which He [Christ] inaugurated through the veil, that is His flesh". I plead with the Father for many to experience a lifting of the veil of darkness by the knowledge of His Son. Thank you CBA for allowing us the time out of the office. I pray that our experience there helps us to serve you well in the days ahead. We are a blessed people who have grown accustomed to freedoms we do not even think about on a daily basis. The USA, with all of our faults, still affords us religious freedoms other countries do not extend to their citizens. May we never take that for granted. If you have a desire to go to Israel, I encourage you to put it on the short list. Be in charge of your time there and have a plan. Be intentional and look for God at work. Pray for the lives you will touch while visiting. God is doing some incredible things in Israel! Make no mistake, the redeemed are knitted together by one Spirit and it is universal. Much like we do here, you will feel at home among believers, mourn for those who have been persecuted, and be jealous for those who worship the Father yet deny the Son. Those that shouted "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord," fully understood they were to praise the Lord passionately with a loud voice. If Israel's rocky landscape were to cry out in their stead, it would have been deafening! Oh, and to set your mind at ease, I felt safer there than I do here. Marni
