### A Word from Your Missionary, Steve Laughman



The greatest need at this time is in the clothing division (it needs a minimum of 10 volunteers with only five currently) and the registration/counseling area, however, all areas need help. Volunteers may choose to work from one hour a week to four or five hours a week and may choose the area in which to work.
