A Word from Your Mission Strategist, Steve Laughman

"I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit, He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit, He prunes it so that it may bear more fruit." - Jesus of Nazareth (John 15:1-2)

Jesus spoke these words to the apostles on the night He was betrayed and arrested. It appears He is referring to individuals, how we are to remain in Him in order to bear fruit for the kingdom. While this is absolutely true for each individual Christian, I believe we can apply the same principles to each local body of believers.

Pruning is no fun for the branch. It seems painful, harsh, and sudden. What seemed to be growth has now suddenly been taken away for the sake of the entire branch. Frankly, it seems a little counterproductive. Why would you cut away growth and expect it to help the branch? Yet that is God's design for the vine and, evidently, for us as well.

It has now been one year since the pandemic began. Life has changed dramatically for us as individuals and for us as the church. Although things might be different now, I also believe God has used this year to prune us. He has taken away things, and in their place, we have found the resources to do something more productive. > did before is worth doing again, but other things were pruned away for a reason. Take time to evaluate the health of your church body and to prioritize those things that matter most. I think you may find that God has made it possible for you to grow in ways you never thought of before.

Molena Baptist Church is going through a bit of a relaunch and the changes have made quite a buzz in Molena, Georgia. I was able to attend a Sunday morning service a couple of weeks ago with Steve. It was the first time I had heard Pastor Terry Murphey preach

since he began preaching there a couple of years ago. That morning his wife, Cindy, played the drums and Pamela, his daughter, played the piano and sang. Terry Murphey, Jr is the Youth Director. This church is very much a family affair. The change that created quite a buzz is located in the parking lot. They purchased

Baptist Church". The phones began to ring and people started asking questions. Many in Molena wondered if the property had been sold to another congregation of worshippers. Thankfully, that was not the case at all. Molena went through a simple name change to jump-start a relaunch. With the new Facebook page where the Sunday services are livestreamed, the church is able to reach

a larger demographic. During Pastor Terry's message, he spoke about wanting to reach outside of normal comfort zones to reach the hurting people that would not feel comfortable in a traditional church environment. As a volunteer counselor with a ministry called "A Better Way Ministries"

Pastor Terry works closely with individuals that are recovering from life choices that have had some hard consequences. Pastor Terry challenged those in attendance and those that were watching that day to engage hurting people and minister to them right where they are at.

Throughout the pandemic,

Molena/Grace Community has not closed for worship at all. Steve and I have found that smaller congregations do not experience the social distancing dilemmas that larger fellowships encounter. We pray for each of the churches to navigate the pandemic as the Lord directs. What works for some does not always work for others.
