## A Word from Your Mission Strategist, Steve Laughman

A few month ago I watched a movie that had quite a twist at the end. When the truth was revealed, I am sure I reacted like many others who had watched it – with surprise and a sense of satisfaction that I had been drawn in by the plot. But when I thought about it, the clues were there from the beginning. I probably should have seen the end coming. That's the beauty of hindsight.

The Gospel writers knew before they penned their accounts that Jesus had already risen from the dead. By the time they wrote, they had been preaching about the resurrection and had probably been persecuted for it. But, to their credit, they repeatedly acknowledge their own

lack of understanding as the events took place. Jesus told them a number of times that he was going to be arrested, beaten, and killed. He also told them that he would be resurrected. At least once he even said it would take three days just like Jonah's time in the fish. But when it actually happened, they acted as though they didn't see it coming.

The death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ is essential



"He has clearly told us that He will return." for our faith. We celebrate the resurrection every Sunday when we gather for worship. I am so thankful that we have the benefit of Scripture to guide us in our understanding of who Jesus is and what He has done for us. I cannot say for certain that I would have picked up on the clues if I had been walking with Jesus during His time here on earth.

In the same way, He has clearly told us that He will return. He gave us signs and clues. He instructed us to be watching and waiting. He told us what to look for and even gave us the Lord's Supper to remind us that one day we will celebrate together with Him. We can debate the sequence of events regarding His return, but we all know that He is coming. My prayer is that we will not be like the disciples, arguing about who is greatest in the kingdom while Jesus is trying to tell us His plans.

Until He comes again may we be found proclaiming the truth of the Resurrection and the Life. And like the apostle John wrote in the Revelation, "He who testifies to these things says, 'Yes, I am coming quickly.' Amen. Come, Lord Jesus. The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all. Amen."

### **Shepherd Stories**

My son, Silas Laughman, picked up a tennis racquet for the first time in the spring of his freshman year, and he hasn't laid it down since. He has held the 1st seed Singles spot on Upson-Lee high school's boys tennis team since the beginning of his sophomore year. He loves the sport! Coach Boz, many of you may know him as Tim Bosworth- Pastor of New Harmony, was excited when Silas and two of his best friends walked onto the tennis courts four years ago. It was the beginning of something excellent, and they all knew it. Coach mentored the boys and encouraged them to put in the work. Silas, John Hernandez, and Jed Weatherford would leave practice after school everyday just to be dropped off at the tennis courts in town. They would play until dark. When they started driving and got part-time jobs we all thought the love of the sport would at least dwindle a bit. It never did. As a matter of fact, they encouraged younger guys to join the team as well. They became something to reckon with. These guys could all be found on the courts any day that the weather cooperated. Then Covid hit. During lockdown, the courts were chained closed and the 2020 season came to an abrupt halt. Coach Boz was beyond proud of their dedication. Fast forward a bit to 2021. Upson-Lee dropped from AAAA to AAA, and we all knew that meant our boys team would have a good chance at pulling off Region Champs. They finished the season UNDEFEATED Region Champs and made it to the state quarter finals... Elite 8, Baby! They played hard and had nothing to be ashamed of. They made history this season. Upson-Lee has never finished a tennis season like this one! Before every match, Coach Boz would rally the boys together for a pep talk and prayer. Some days the boys would lead the prayer and some days Coach would. As a believing parent, it was a beautiful thing to watch. One visiting coach, also a believer, asked Tim how he was allowed to pray with the team before the matches. Tim just smiled. What he didn't say was that any one of those boys would have rallied behind him if something were to ever be said. Guys... that is

what Jesus looks like on the court. Leading by example. Loving his team well to the glory of God. I personally witnessed guys apologizing for acting out or displaying unsportsmanlike conduct. I heard Coach Boz reprimand players for unbecoming attitudes. We played teams that had a very different standard modeled. It was discouraging for our guys and for us as fans. If you know my Silas, you know he is not very social. It's almost painful to watch. I'm not sure where he gets that quiet spirit. But on the court, he is a different person. Coach Boz gave my son space to belong, a community of believers to grow with, and a healthy environment where he was lead by a man who loved God and loved others well. I will forever be grateful for Tim Bosworth and his place in our lives. I will miss watching this group of guys on the court. Shepherding doesn't always happen within the walls of church. Sometimes, it happens on the tennis courts.
