#### Proposed amended bylaw regarding the structure of the Steering Committee:

### STEERING COMMITTEE:

The Steering Committee shall be composed of eleven members. Members will include the chairpersons of all (3) standing committees, Ministry Leaders for each of the (4) Priority Teams, and four (4) at-large members. All vacancies shall be filled by the Nominating Committee. Duties: Work in close harmony with the Associational Mission Strategist and have general oversight of his work. They shall see that the properties of the Association are kept in proper repair. They shall encourage the churches to give generously to the Association. This Committee shall be the Trustees of the Association. This Committee shall elect its own Chairman at its first meeting of the year. Amendment: October 21, 2014. That the Steering Committee have the authority to make necessary Executive Committee decisions between Associational Meetings.

Note: Rotation among members of the Steering Committee will naturally occur as the members are added to or roll-off the committees and teams. At-large members will continue to serve rotating 3 year terms, as well.

## A Word from Your Mission Strategist, Steve Laughman

What is to be our first priority?

As mission-minded, Gospel-preaching, Bible-believing Baptists, most of us would immediately answer this question by quoting Matthew 28:19-20: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to follow all that I commanded you..." In fact, our mission statement as an association echoes this command: Networking Churches to Make Disciples.

Recently I attended a training event for associational leaders

and was challenged with something I had never truly considered. The speaker said that for twenty years of his pastoral ministry, he considered himself an evangelist and a Great Commission pastor. He would have responded to my question exactly like most of us would have. Around year 20 of his ministry, he was given a sabbatical where he spent time alone in a cabin with God's Word. It was there that he was hit with the context of Matthew 22:36-40. "Teacher, which is the great commandment of the law?" And He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." This is the great and foremost commandment. The

second is like it, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Upon these two

He began to think about why Jesus would respond this way rather than to tell the man to go and make disciples, baptizing them and teaching them to obey. If Jesus came to seek and to save that which was lost, shouldn't the greatest commandment be to follow in his footsteps and seek and save the lost? Yet Jesus answered with two very familiar commandments from the Torah. Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 19:18 had not been traditionally linked until Jesus identified them as the greatest and second commandments, respectively. So, the question remains why Jesus would say this.

According to Jesus Himself, all the other commandments depend on these two. In other words, even the command He would soon give to go and make disciples would depend on these two commandments. If we do not love God or our neighbor, we will not go, we will not tell, we will not make

disciples. On the other hand, if we love God with all we are and we love our neighbor as ourselves, we cannot help telling our neighbor, whom we love, about the God whom we love. We want them to follow Him and love Him as we do. Our passion for the Gospel will be rightly centered on the person of God and not an obligation we feel toward sharing our faith.

So, what is our first priority? According to Jesus, it is to love the Lord with all our heart, soul, and mind. Out of that love flows our love for others and our passion to see disciples made and the Gospel proclaimed.





Have you ever taken an inventory of your prayers? You probably pray for people who are sick, your church and its leaders, the lost, missionaries, and the grieving. You may pray that our society will improve. I have been a pastor for over fifty years and in most of the prayer meetings I have attended, these are the things that are usually shared. You should be praying for these things. You should pray for your own needs: your problems, desires, and family. Also include praise to God for who He is, thanks to Him for all He has done for you, and confession of your sins.

The Apostle Paul said in Ephesians 6:18 "... always keep on praying for all the saints." In the Bible a saint is not a super Christian but any Christian. Paul means our fellow believers. You pray for their material, physical, and emotional

needs. Yet many believers pray very little for their fellow believers' spiritual needs. There is seldom a prayer shared for fellow believers to grow in their faith, in Christlikeness, and in becoming effective disciples of the Lord Jesus.

### "What should we pray for our fellow believers?"

The Bible gives an answer. In this devotional guide you will find what Paul prayed for the members in some New Testament churches. In Philippians 4:9a Paul said, "Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me—put it into practice." Paul's prayers for his fellow believers provide a pattern for us as we pray for one another. Imagine the renewal your church will experience if such prayers are prayed and answered.
