

New Hope Thomaston will be hosting a FREE concert to raise money for Lottie Moon on Saturday, Nov. 20th at 6:30 PM.



This photo was taken at King's Chapel Baptist Church on August 20, 2017. At the request of Pastor Eddie Mathews, Dr. White, Executive Director of the Georgia Baptist Mission Board, preached the 175th Homecoming message. A plaque was given to King's Chapel to commemorate the event and Steve and I were honored to have been asked to attend as well. What a great day in the house of the Lord! I can't help but wonder if the founding members had any idea that their leap of faith would be the foundation for a legacy such as this. I sat in that quaint sanctuary, as I have done a few times since moving to Thomaston, and had to wipe away tears from my cheeks. Everything reminded me of being a small child. I



remember standing on scarlet padded pews careful not to disturb the removable cushion; my small hands holding that heavy hymnal and my Granny helping me find the right page; singing as loud as I possibly could because that's what everyone around me was doing; watching my Pastor wave his worn limp black Bible around as if it were his Banner; being puzzled why his shouting preacher voice was suddenly replaced by a hoarse broken tear filled one; questioning why people seemed to fall on their faces on the steps that lined the pulpit; then as I left being squeezed so tightly in a sweaty embrace. Although Eddie Mathews is not the Pastor of my childhood, he embodies everything I remember as an impressionable spiritually hungry girl. Eddie loves the Word. He loves to preach the Word. He loves his wife, Cathy. She is in need of healing. Will you please pray for that? It is my great privilege and honor to sit under one that I admire.
